



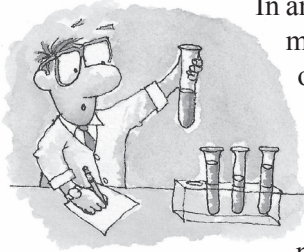

You can help keep our water clean!

When you think of “water pollution,” what do you think of? Maybe you envision a factory discharging some sort of chemical into the environment, or an oil spill from a tanker accident. Perhaps you are thinking of an old landfill or the mishandling of fuel at a gas station.

But did you know that the Number 1 source of water pollution today is something as commonplace as rainwater runoff? No matter where the rainwater goes, it has the ability to pick up pollution along the way, even from your back yard or driveway! This pollution can end up in our precious water resources by flowing into streams and rivers, or soaking into the soil to reach our groundwater supplies.

Don’t Dump: Anything you put on the ground or down a storm drain can make its way into our groundwater or other water sources. Contact the Lehigh County Office of

Solid Waste at 610-799-4177 to find out how to dispose of household hazardous wastes.

Lawn Care: Use only as much fertilizer as your lawn or garden really needs, and be sure to pick up after your pets!

Care for Your Car: Oil spots left on driveways and parking lots can wash away with the rain and will end up back in the environment.

Report Spills: Call 9-1-1 if you witness accidental or intentional dumping of unknown substances into our environment!
