In Pennsylvania, our climate and normal rainfall amounts are advantagous for a wide variety of native plant species that are both beautiful and hardy. Using plants that are native to our region in your landscaping can help you to conserve water, as they will thrive under normal weather conditions without supplemental watering. And because they are native to Pennsylvania, you can expect beautiful results for less money and effort than you would expend on more exotic, non-native species.
